# Ballarat Buddies for International Students

The idea for this project was inspired by the need for social connections within the Ballarat community. As I pondered the impacts of the pandemic on the global population as a whole, I thought about the local university students who were doing it that bit tougher. Economically most definitely, but living in such isolation and so far from their home country, culture, family and friends, feels like an entirely different thing. More so when, back home, family and friends are suffering such enormous hardships and distress while living in the time of COVID.

I remember back in my own travelling days and living abroad experiences and how the moments that stayed with me were those when meeting, staying with and/or getting to know the local people of the land. To share in their culture and country through their tales, their eyes and taste, is a journey and creates moments that are treasured. I think the experiences work both ways, we learn together about other's cultural ways.

What better way to make connections in the broader Ballarat community than to create this pathway? This is a great chance for people to meet for a cuppa and engage in activities as a group.

# Ballarat Community Garden

Hello from the Ballarat Community Garden! If you have never found us, we are on the corner of Queen Street and Dyte Parade, Ballarat East, right next to the railway line. We have about 80 members who each has a plot to grow whatever we wish. Most of us like to be able to eat what we grow but some people enjoy a display of flowers.

The garden is looking great as the weather has warmed up. We are now harvesting broad beans, peas, silver beet and lettuce while the standard summer crops are growing strongly. Tomatoes, beans, carrots, potatoes, corn and zucchini have all been planted and will provide a continuous supply of fresh vegetables right through the summer months. The next planting season will be in early February when cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli and brussels sprouts are planted for Autumn and Winter harvesting.

The good rain we have had during spring has been great for our plants which have produced prolific growth all around the garden. Our ride-on mower has been well-used by members to keep paths and walkways neat and tidy.

Thank you to everyone who supported our seedling sale in October. We hope the seedlings are growing strongly and will start to



produce good crops. We have built another hot house in anticipation of producing even more seedlings next year. Thank you to the Ballarat Regional Multicultural Council (BRMC) for funding the new hothouse through the Thrive Project, a joint initiative.

An outdoor pizza oven is fired up most Friday afternoons during the summer months when our members enjoy a shared meal and good company during the cool of those lovely summer evenings. A well-appointed common room is available for a coffee and chat with our friends at any time of the year.

Half-a-dozen chooks provide us with eggs and some good fertilizer for our gardens. Volunteers from within our group take turns to tend the birds' needs, ensuring they have food and water. They are locked away in a secure enclosure each evening to keep them safe from foxes and other predators.

The Garden is a wonderful refuge during these difficult times. To get out in the fresh air, getting your hands dirty in the soil and watering and tending those beautiful plants producing our own food, is great therapy. Chatting to other gardeners, sharing skills and knowledge is great to help form friendships with likeminded people.

We do have a turnover of members at the Garden. Some people move away from town while others find that ageing limbs mean that they are unable to continue to care for the garden.

In late-October 2021, the City of Ballarat's Council approved a fouryear Strategic Partnership proposal from the four Neighbourhood Houses in Ballarat.

This project will see the four Ballarat Houses (in Ballarat East, Ballarat North, Wendouree and Sebastopol) working closely together to support community groups across our city.

A Governance Officer will be available two days per week to engage with local community groups and build capacity through training workshops and resources around governance, grant writing, financial management, running effective meetings, managing volunteers and applying for incorporation.
